UNIDAD N°: 1 INTERESTING LIVES

LOGRO

By the end of the unit students will ask questions to find out about someone's interests and backgrounds and tell interesting stories about their own lives.

TEMARIO

- * Use simple and continuous forms of verbs (review)
- * Use verbs that are followed by verb + ing or to + verb.
- * Tell an interesting story about your life
- * Use the present tense to highlight key moments in a story.
- * Use this and these to highlight important people, things, and events.

8 / Weeks 1 and 2

UNIDAD N°: 2 PERSONAL TASTES**LOGRO**

By the end of the unit students will talk about makeovers, style, and fashion and talk about their tastes in clothes and music.

TEMARIO

- * Make comparisons with (not) as...as.
- * Ask negative questions when you want someone to agree.
- * Talk about fashion and your tastes in clothes and music.
- * Show understanding by summarizing what people say.
- * Use Now to introduce a follow-up question on a different aspect of a topic.

HORA(S) / SEMANA(S)

8 / Weeks 3 and 4

UNIDAD N°: 3 WORLD CULTURES**LOGRO**

By the end of the unit students will talk about aspects of their culture and talk about manners, customs, and culturally appropriate behavior.

TEMARIO

- * Use the simple present passive to talk about traditional things.
- * Talk about manners using verb + ing and to + verb.
- * Talk about different cultures and customs.
- * Use expressions like in fact to sound more direct when you speak.
- * Use of course to give information that is not surprising or to show you understand or agree.

Note: Review and practice of contents in units 1, 2 and 3 and Mid-term exam.

HORA(S) / SEMANA(S)

8 / Weeks 5 and 6

UNIDAD N°: 4 SOCIALIZING

LOGRO

By the end of the unit students will talk about things they are supposed to do, things they were supposed to do, and things that are supposed to happen. They will also talk about going out and socializing.

TEMARIO

- * Talk about things you are supposed to do.
- * Use was / were supposed to and was / were going to talk about things you didn't do.
- * Talk about going out and socializing.
- * Use different expressions with the verb get.
- * Use questions in the form of statements to check your understanding.
- * Use so in different ways, such as to as to start or close a topic.

HORA(S) / SEMANA(S)

8 / Weeks 9 and 10

UNIDAD N°: 5 LAW AND ORDER**LOGRO**

By the end of the unit students will talk about rules and regulations and talk about crime and punishment.

TEMARIO

- * Use the passive of modal verbs.
- * Use the get passive.
- * Talk about rules and regulations.
- * Organize your views with expressions like First of all, Basically, etc.
- * Use expressions like That's a good point to show someone has a valid argument.

HORA(S) / SEMANA(S)

8 / Weeks 11 and 12

UNIDAD N°: 6 STRANGE EVENTS**LOGRO**

By the end of the unit students will talk about coincidences and strange events and talk about belief in superstitions.

TEMARIO

- * Use the past perfect.
- * Use responses with So and Neither.
- * Talk about coincidences, superstitions, and strange events.
- * Repeat your ideas to make your meaning clear.
- * Use just to make what you say stronger and softer.

Note: Review and practice of contents in units 4, 5 and 6.

8 / Weeks 13 and 14

VI. METODOLOGÍA

This course will provide students with many English language opportunities. During this semester, students will practice what they already know and will learn new grammar, vocabulary, expressions and communicative skills. Classes will be run as discussions and interactive situations in which all students are required to participate. Personal commitment and self-study are also important. Students will have to work on the material on line (book and workbook) and will be asked to gradually develop the exercises.

Students will have the opportunity of monitoring their progress through a number of different activities and exams applied in class. Different activities and exercises are done in class to assess student's different skills in the language. There will also be Prácticas Calificadas and exams (mid-term and final) which are the big evaluations in grammar, vocabulary, and use of language.
